So far, there is no word from the Civil Air Patrol about the "Wreathes Across America" Ceremony that should be on Saturday, December 14<sup>th</sup>. All are color guard events, but at the same time they should be given the full support of the chapter membership. That's something we have lacked in the past.

I hope the membership will turn out for our program this month. Albemarle Chapter President Chris Grimes will be our guest speaker. He will present a program on the Llewellyn Conspiracy that was centered in the Halifax area during the Revolution.

If this comes about, we will mark the grave of John Whitaker, a Colonel in the Continental Army, who is buried at Whitaker's Chapel east of Enfield. The Halifax Resolves Chapter NCSSAR met at the Halifax United Methodist Church on Wednesday, May 8th at 6:30 pm. HRC President Ken Wilson called the meeting to order and Compatriot Geoff Pittard offered the Invocation. Pres. Wilson led the gathering in the Pledge of Allegiance and the SAR Pledge. NSSAR SE Dist. VPG G. Steven Pittard brought greetings from the National Society and NCSSAR Sr. VP Chuck Yard brought greetings from the North Carolina Society. Following the meal, VPG Pittard presented the Secretary's Report in the absence of Sec.-Treas. Avent. The report was unanimously accepted as read on a motion from Cleveland Hawkins and 2nd from VPG Pittard. The Treasurer's report was read by Pres. Wilson and unanimously accepted on motion from VPG Pittard and 2nd from R.J. Myrick. Pres. Wilson then informed the chapter of his activities since the last meeting:

- \* Awarded Certificates of Appreciation to Cornerstone Christian School teachers Renee Walker & Linda Brown, Belmont Elementary School teachers Donna Hardy, Amanda Carter and Adrienne Powell and Halifax Academy teacher Tracy Lynch for supporting the Americanism Poster contest
- \* The winning student was Eli Harris of Halifax Academy who received a certificate and a check for \$100.00, Ten Honorable Mention Certificates were awarded and 39 participant certificates
- \*Participated in the April Roanoke Valley Veterans Museum "Veteran of the Month" ceremony
- \*Acted as Burn Master for the Flag Retirement ceremony on Halifax Day and as MC for the Halifax Resolves ceremony
- \* Presented a program on the NC Flag and Halifax during the Revolution to the 4th & 5th grade classes at Cornerstone Christian School
- \* Attended the NCSSAR Convention
- \* Elected NE NC Dist. 1 VP
- \*Awarded a Flag Certificate to the Northampton Co., Courthouse
- \* Awarded Outstanding JROTC Medal at Northern Nash HS
- \*Awarded Outstanding JROTC Medal at Central Nash HS
- \*Approx. 100 U.S. flags & 20 NC, military service & first responder flags to retire
- \*Americanism points: 4495 P-G Streamer: 225

Pres. Wilson then reported on the events leading up to the proposal to mark the grave of Patriot John Whitaker at Whitaker's Chapel in Enfield. Even though a ceremony was performed by the DAR July 4, 1928, there is no marker showing the DAR performed the ceremony. NCSDAR Historian Karen Powell and Elizabeth Montford Ashe Regent Carol Guidry have given permission for the ceremony to take place. The DAR will be asked to take part in the ceremony. An anonymous donor has come forward and volunteered to pay for the granite marker. Chaplain Rev. Duncan Jones is contacting the family to obtain permission to do the ceremony. The caretakers of the church will also have to give permission since this is an historical site. Proposed date is mid September.

The program presented by first covered events at the state convention and NCSSAR Pres. James H. Wood's goals for the upcoming year. Sr. VP Yard also commented on the goals set by Pres. Wood. Next he covered the new awards for members that have been approved by the National Society. They included the Chapter Distinguished Service Medal (available only in 2013-2014), the Roger Sherman Medal, the Patriot Grave Marking Medal, the Molly Pritcher Medal, and medals being struck now to support the endowment funds of the JROTC, Eagle Scout, Knight Essay, and Rumbaugh Oration contests.
