Luncheon, and the Halifax Resolves ceremony on April 10th. We are also in need of a chapter photographer.


The NCSSAR Convention will be held in Charlotte April 23-24. Further information can be found on the state website (www.ncssar.com).

Sec/Treas Steve Avent reported that he will be attending the SAR commemoration at the Cowpens Battlefield on 1/16/2010. He also moved that the chapter participate in the NCSSAR poster contest and award the winner a \$50 Savings Bond. The motion was approved.

Battle of Cowpens Celebration

The 229th Anniversary Celebration of the Battle of Cowpens was held on the battlefield near Chesnee, SC, on Sat., 1/16/2010. This is one of the premier SAR events and is always well-attended by SAR compatriots from NC and SC. The weather for this event is usually bitterly cold, but this year's moderate temperatures brought out dozens of participants and hundreds of spectators. Re-enactors (both Patriot and British) set up camp, and there were cavalry demonstrations as well as many other activities, and a good time was had by all. The Halifax Resolves Chapter was represented by Registrar Allen Brahin (who served on the Color Guard) and Sec/Treas Steve Avent (who presented a wreath).


