An invocation was given by Chaplain Rev. Duncan Jones, and then all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the US Flag. Compatriot David Gammon led the members in the SAR Pledge. He introduced Historic Halifax employee and potential SAR member Frank McMahon to the group.

In the absence of Secretary/Treasurer Steve Avent, President Wilson briefly discussed the minutes from the previous meeting, which were approved. The Treasurer's report indicated a total balance of \$2,053.51, of which the subcategories include the Youth Fund with a balance of \$1070.00 and the General Fund with a balance of \$983.51.
