The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carlos I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to REVOLU-TIONARY WAR patriots. 

We already have a good program scheduled for each meeting through the winter and we need to have a good turn out. Any suggestions for future programs will be appreciated.



# Nathaniel Macon



Nathaniel Macon (1758–1837), a Warren County native, entered public service in 1781 when he was elected to the North Carolina Senate. He later served North Carolina in the U.S. House of Representatives (1791–1815) and in the U.S. Senate (1815–1828).

During this period he held numerous important positions in the Congress and was respected by his peers. Thomas Jefferson hailed Macon as "the last of the Romans" for his steadfast devotion to Republican ideals.

In 1829, when Macon retired from public life, he was one of the most powerful and influential men in the United States. He was honored by his peers by the creation of "Macon" Counties in Illinois, Georgia, North Carolina and Alabama. Both Georgia and Mississippi have cities named for him. Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, VA and Fort Macon in NC bear his name. He died in 1837 and was buried beside his wife at his homeplace in Warren Co., NC.

We are currently negotiating with Warren Co. officials to hold a SAR grave marking ceremony at Macon's grave later on this year. Chapter VP Ken Wilson will be providing more information about this project at the meeting.
