$oldsymbol{T}$ he Sons of the American Revolution is a PATRIOTIC organization formed in 1889 and chartered by the U.S. Congress in 1906, with more than 25,000 living mem-bers from all 50 states and 23 foreign countries. Throughout its 120-year history, the SAR has admitted more than 155.000 members. Among them are 16 PRESI-**DENTS** of the **UNITED** STATES. including George W. Bush and his father George H. W. Bush, Jimmy Carter, Dwight D. Eisenhower, Harry Truman and Theodore Roosevelt. The SAR also has had among its members Sir Winston Churchill and King Juan Carlos I of Spain, both of whom trace their ancestry to REVOLU-TIONARY WAR patriots. Membership requires proof of descent from a person who aided in the PATRIOT cause. Some of the activities in which we engage are:

* educational programs in the schools and elsewhere on the ideals of our Patriot ancestors and the American Revolution * recognition of outstanding law enforcement officers and JROTC cadets * sponsorship of Boy Scout troops



Col. Whitmel Hill Grave Marking



Colonel Whitmel Hill was born on 12 Feb 1743 in Palmyra Plantation, Halifax, NC, and died about 1797 and is buried in Scotland Neck. He was one of the leading figures from NC during the Revolution, serving as Colonel of the Martin Co. Militia, Representative at the Congresses in Hillsborough in 1775 and Halifax in 1776, a Councilor of State and a Delegate to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia.

On Sat., 9/12 at 2:00 pm the Chapter will be dedicating a SAR Patriot grave marker at Col. Hill's grave at Old Trinity Episcopal Church in Scotland Neck. The keynote speaker will be author and genealogist David B. Gammon, who is also a direct descendant of Col. Hill. Try to come out if you can and show your support for the Chapter.
