Compatriots,

On November 8, 2017, I was honored to accept the gavel and be sworn in as your new chapter president. Thank you for your confidence in me.

Several of you have asked me why I am a member of the Halifax Resolves Chapter when I actually live in Morehead City. In short, it's because all my roots are in the Roanoke River Valley. I grew up on my parents' farm between Leggett and Whitakers in Edgecombe County. Three of my grandparents had most of their roots in Halifax County; the fourth was from Warren County.

My father G.R. Gammon was born and raised on his parent's farm in the tiny community of Draughan in northern Edgecombe County. His father Roland Gammon farmed his entire life in that community, and his mother Allean Quincy Gammon was a homemaker. My mother Rebecca Bryant was born and raised in Scotland Neck. Her father David Bryant worked for many years at the Columbia Peanut Company there, and her mother Nannie Shields Bryant taught piano and was organist at the Episcopal Church there for more than fifty years.

After college, I moved to Raleigh, where I taught school for a few years at the high school and college levels, and later served as a school administrator until my retirement in 2007. It was then that I moved to Morehead City, where I have been ever since. I

am often back and forth between the coast and Halifax County, where I frequently do research and visit relatives and friends.

The Halifax Resolves Chapter of the NCSSAR met on Wednesday, November 8, 2017, at the Halifax United Methodist Church in Halifax, NC. President Ken Wilson called the meeting to order at 6:30. An invocation was given by Chaplain Rev. Duncan Jones, and then all present joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the US Flag, followed by the SAR Pledge. He introduced those present at the head tables and honorees in the audience, including NCSSAR State President George Strunk, Halifax Resolves DAR Chapter Regent Roberta Josey, Halifax County Commissioner Suetta Scarborough, Roanoke Rapids City Manager Joe Scherer, Roanoke Rapids Police Chief Chuck Hasty and his wife Tonya, and Roanoke Rapids Fire Chief Stacy Coggins and his wife Angela. President Strunk brought greetings from the NCSSAR.

In the absence of Secretary/Treasurer Steve Avent, President Wilson briefly discussed the minutes from the previous meeting, which were approved. The Treasurer's report indicated a total balance of \$2,015.84, of which the subcategories include the Youth Fund with a balance of \$1070.00 and the General Fund with a balance of \$945.84. The Treasurer's report was approved. As part of his President's report, President Wilson explained changes in the allocation of streamers and medals for patriot and compatriot grave markings.

President Wilson and Compatriot David Gammon attended the Regional Vice Presidents' Meeting in Williamston on Saturday, November 4.

The Veterans Ceremony will be in the Veterans Park in Roanoke Rapids on November 11 at 11:30.

We will host compatriot grave markings for James Carlos Harris (near Inez) and Joseph Pippen (in Littleton) sometime in 2018, pending family approval and the coordination of our calendar with other state and national events.
