## Minutes of January Meeting

The Chapter met on Wednesday, January 10th, 2024, at the Halifax United Methodist Church in Halifax, NC. President Geoff Pittard called the meeting to order at 1831. Harry Albert gave the invocation and then Mark Pace led the Chapter in the Pledge of Allegiance. Lastly, Steve Avent led the Chapter in the SAR Pledge. There were no introductions of new members or guests. President Pittard then dismissed us to our meal. After our meal, we then had our presentation of awards for 2023.

Renny Taylor received the Bronze Roger Sherman Medal, the Halifax United Methodist Church ladies, Frankie King and Linda Pressley, each received the Henry Knox medal, while the group of all of the Halifax United Methodist Church ladies received a Certificate of Appreciation.

At this point, our President-elect, Bill Riggan, introduced Chris Grimes, who would be installing our officers. Chris Grimes is the State Chaplain and Senior Vice President of the NCSSAR, and is the President of the Albemarle Chapter. In addition to his SAR duties, Chris is a Historical Interpreter at the Mariner's Museum, Newport News, VA and a Living Historian/Reenactor with a focus on 18th and 19th century medicine, naval matters and artillery. Following the introduction, Sr. Vice President Grimes gave a brief speech about the SAR's 250th Anniversary celebration, to be held in 2026, and then proceeded to the installation of Chapter Officers. Mark Pace, Michael Cooper, and Steve Avent were then asked to the front of the room where they were sworn into their positions, which were as follows:

After Sr. VP Grimes administered the oaths of office, the chapter was then asked to give their support to the new officers. Those officers were asked to return to their seats while Sr VP Grimes installed President-elect Bill Riggan. After his installation, President Riggan then thanked the whole Chapter and commented on his positive outlook for the Chapter and his excitement about the Chapter's future. The Chapter then proceeded with a couple of special award presentations. Past Chapter President Geoff Pittard was called forward by Sr VP Grimes, who presented him with the Chapter Distinguished Service Medal, which is the highest award which can be presented at the chapter level. Past President Pittard then called forward Chapter President Riggan and presented him with the Meritorious Service Medal. President Riggan gave his thanks to Geoff, the Chapter, and most importantly, his wife, Vickie, for her support.

Now the Chapter began its business meeting. First item presented was the minutes of our November 2023 meeting which were read by Secretary Michael Cooper. Next item presented was our Treasurers report which was read by Treasurer Steve Avent. Next was the Registrar's report and was given by President Riggan. Next on our agenda

was the Committee reports. First presented was the Knight Essay which was given by Renny Taylor. Our Chapter has completed its part in the grading of the 27 entries. The essay that scored the highest by our Chapter will be read aloud by its author and the Chapter's March Meeting. The Poster and Brochure contest was next. We were informed that Jamie Rook was unable to make the meeting. Next on our agenda was the induction of our new member, Tucker Nobles of Louisburg, NC. He was given the oath and sworn in by President Riggan. President Riggan commented on the difficulty of his application.

We then had the introduction of our new member and his guests. Mr. Nobles was accompanied by his nephew and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Pace. When asked to say a few words he said, and I quote, "I appreciate it."

Our Installing officer's remarks then took place. Senior Vice President Chris Grimes commented that he was really excited about the future of our Chapter and again asked that if anyone needs help with an SAR task to please reach out to him and others. Lastly, came the new President's remarks. President Riggan thanked Sr VP Grimes for his mentorship and also thanked a Past President of ours, Ken Wilson, for his guidance and knowledge. He then read a thank you card to our Chapter for its representation at the Wreaths Across America event in Louisburg's Oakwood Cemetery.

He mentioned that he recently spoke with State Treasurer and Past State President Sam Powell, who informed him about Citizenship Awards that can be given out by the chapter, and President Riggan stated that this is something he's planning to look into for the Halifax Chapter. The exact requirements for this award are still being worked out. Lastly, President Riggan spoke of Service awards which will be given out for the length of time that a member has been in the SAR. Our SAR Recessional then took place and was led by past President Geoff Pittard. The Benediction was given by Harry Albert, and President Bill Riggan adjourned the meeting at 1957.


