Our friends at Davidsons Fort in Old Fort, North Carolina continue to work in the community and help the town to recover or at least have some sense of recovery. If you have been assisting in any of the recovery efforts in the area, we commend what you are doing and would like to hear about what you have been doing to assist with all that needs to be done in western North Carolina.







One activity we were able to participate in was our annual visit with the 2024 Leadership Lincoln class on their "History of Lincoln County Day". On 9 October, Chapter President Roy Lightfoot presented a shortened program about the Battle of Ramsour's Mill. Lightfoot was able to present the program on the front porch of the cabin located on the battlefield and discussed with them the importance of the battle in our local, state, and national history during the American Revolution. He discussed the events leading to the battle and discussed the aftermath and the effects on local events including the Battle of Kings Mountain.
